## Shelf Life

It looks like 2006 is shaping up to be an exciting and busy year at the Law Library! We still have a stack of new after-hours access cardkeys that haven't been exchanged, yet. So, come get your new cardkey! On the same subject, please remember that you need to use the new cardkey when you enter **and exit** the courthouse. Obviously, you need to swipe the cardkey to gain entry. However, if you don't swipe the cardkey before you attempt to exit, an alarm will sound. As a reminder, the new cardkeys allow the same access that has always been available. This means that you cannot gain entry to the courthouse through the back door using your cardkey during regular business hours (7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). Also, your old, red plastic cardkey still provides you after-hours access to the Law Library.

As you may have noticed, we're working on making the copying and printing process more efficient and effective. The first step in this process involved moving the laser printer and re-routing the computer terminal wiring. While this was being done, all print requests could be retrieved from the laser jet printer at the front desk. The second step was to route the print requests from all of the computer terminals to the copy/print machine located in the "copy" room. The second step was successful and I'm pleased to announce that all print requests can now be retrieved from the copier/printer. The final step will involve issuing everyone a pass code number and configuring the machine to copy/print upon receiving a code. Eventually, this process will enable us to retire the copy billing log notebook, since the copy/print machine will track your usage automatically. Once we get the kinks worked out, it will make the copy/print and billing process easier for everyone. As always, please let us know if you have any comments and/or suggestions.

## From the Trial Court Administrator:

### Attorneys Removing Files from the Court's Record Center

The Records Department at the Clackamas County Courthouse has implemented a policy regarding who may remove court files from the Records Center (Rm 12, Ground Floor). Only the attorney of record, or attorney from the same law firm, may request to remove the court file from the Records Center for the purpose of taking it to a courtroom for a hearing or to the Law Library for copying. Please be prepared to show identification when requesting the release of a file. If you are not the attorney of record, the file will not be released to you and the court staff will assist you in making copies or in delivering the file to the courtroom. Court staff in other areas of the courthouse, such as calendaring and case processing, have also been asked to follow this policy when they receive requests from attorneys for court files located in their units. The court file should never be removed from the courthouse. There have been instances where a file has been found in an attorney's briefcase at his or her office.

## Reminders from the Clerk's Office:

The Clerk's office has continued to receive filings which fail to comply with the UTCRs. Please review these guidelines for filing motions and other pleadings prior to submission.

- Do not list multiple case numbers on a pleading; the Clerk needs one original for each case. If you have multiple cases with like pleadings, please file a separate original pleading for each case.
- When submitting multiple pleadings or documents on a single case, staple the pleadings individually and clip them together as a group with a sturdy binder clip.
- Provide adequate copies for all files in consolidated cases. UTCR 2.090 The Clerk must maintain consolidated cases parallel to the original.
- Include case caption and clear title of motion so the Clerk can enter accurately and process them accordingly. UTCR 2.010(11)
- Be sure to have your address, phone number, bar number, fax number, if any, and attorney e-mail address, if any, on your pleadings. UTCR 2.010(7)
- Provide copies for conforming and a self-addressed, stamped envelope that is large enough to return conformed copies.
- Do not Fax pleadings of any kind, including Motions to Continue.
- Two hole punch each pleading or similar document submitted for filing with the court.
- Submit proposed judgments to opposing party (ies) seven (7) days or counsel three (3) days prior to sending to the court. UTCR 5.100
- The judge's signature portion of any order, judgment or writ prepared for the court must appear on a page containing at least two lines of text. UTCR 2.010 (12)(a)

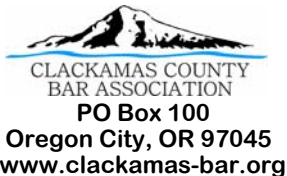
